

Directions to Tulbagh, Alfa and Succulents & Stones:

G.P.S. Co-ordinates: S33°16'56" & E19°08'31"

Please note that as Tulbagh is a destination town and not a drive through one, you will only see Tulbagh road signs once you are very close to Tulbagh. If in doubt along the way (when approaching from Worcester, Malmesbury, Paarl or Wellington, follow signs that point you in the direction of Ceres until you start seeing the Tulbagh signs.)

From Worcester / Wolseley / Ceres side - you will drive straight into the main road (van der Stel Street). Follow directions from # as below.

If you are travelling from Worcester N1 you will follow Ceres and then Wolseley road signs. Long before you reach Ceres, you will turn left to travel through Wolseley and later turn left at the T-junction onto the road that leads to Tulbagh.

From Ceres – you will leave Ceres from the main road straight into the scenic Michells Pass for a few kilometres. Stay on this road for 30 kms and you will be in Tulbagh.

***From R44 / R46** (The R44 becomes the R46 at the Nuwekloof Pass) **Nuwekloof Pass** side you would turn left towards Tulbagh from the R46 and then at the stop street turn left into van der Stel Street (main road).

#From the main road (van der Stel Street), travel past ABSA, STD, FNB, Pep and Spar. Turn right at stop street into Waveren Street. NGK church will now be on your left. Then 2nd left into Buitekant Street and 3rd property on left is Alfa. There is a bell on the gate to be rung to gain access.

Tulbagh from Cape Town

From the N1, travelling in the direction of Paarl, take the turnoff that says R44, Wellington/Klapmuts/Franschoek. Turn left onto the R44 stay on this road. Straight across at the 4-way stop before Wellington, then left at the robot, bypassing Wellington – still on the R44 and continue on to Nuwekloof Pass and then follow directions from * as above .

From the N7 via Malmesbury - shortly after leaving Malmesbury turn left at the board that says Ceres, then bypass Riebeeck West/Kasteel and later Hermon. At the T-Junction after Hermon turn left onto the R44 which will take you to the Nuwekloof Pass – then follow directions from * as above.

The directions as above are the most practical choices and are scenic routes but should you already have travelled these routes, have a little extra time and want to try a different scenic route you can also travel to/from Cape Town via Bainskloof, Du Toitskloof Pass or tunnel and/or the Slanghoek valley.

If approaching Tulbagh from the north on the N1 – you can travel via Worcester or turn right after Touwsrivier via the Theronsberg Pass and Ceres. The second option is slightly shorter. All of the above roads are tarred.
